

Job Description: Freedom Construction Services Foreman

Compensation:

Full-time or Part-Time Position:

Position Summary:

The foreman is responsible for scheduling and logistics on the construction site and the client receives a high-quality product in a timely manner. The primary duties of the foreman are to teach and develop work skills (punctuality, working hard, obeying authority, safety, tool usage, and construction techniques) to and among our program participants while on the job. The foreman will also coordinate tasks for the day, oversee quality of the work, and ensure safety of the site. The foreman will work closely with the Freedom Construction Services Superintendent on progress of each program participant and the status of each job. The foreman will also ensure the project is on budget.

Other responsibilities include:

- Create a work environment where all workers are safe.
- Ensure that the projects are adequately staffed and tasks are assigned.
- Closely supervise all program participants for training and work quality.
- Document each participant's punctuality, attendance, and work ethics.
- Assist with teaching basic trades curriculum in training center, both hands-on and classroom
- Ensure that all ministry equipment and tools are safeguarded and maintained properly.
- Perform other duties as assigned.
